



Table Tray

The table trays for HD Balance are available in two materials:

- Wooden table (oak) (A), with space for the trunk.
- PC table (Polycarbonate) (B), with space for the trunk. The transparent material provides visibility for the person driving and visual body contact for the person sitting in the chair.

Both tables are available with pads for the elbows, (C and D). All tables have a small border that prevents objects to slide off the table.



Supporting Table

The supporting table (E) is padded and can be used as an active support when leaning forward on the forearms, e.g. to stabilize the upper body or to offer a sense of security.




Table brackets

Table brackets are available in two versions

- Standard (not lockable) (F)
- Lockable (G)

The tables are placed in position in table brackets which are mounted in the existing rails in the armrests.



Mug Tray

The mug tray (H) can be used as an alternative table when a smaller surface is desired. The tray has a hole for placing a cup, glass or similar. The tray is rotatable and can be swung away to facilitate movement in and out of the wheelchair. The mug tray uses a special bracket with rotation lock (I). The bracket is mounted in the existing rail on one of the armrests.






The table can be adjusted in depth in two ways:

- 1. Adjust the table brackets position in the arm rail (Phillips screwdriver).
- 2. Adjust the arm pads in depth by moving them forward / backward.

Keep in mind:

- Note: There are restrictions on locking users in the wheelchair against their will. It is up to the prescriber to stay informed about what regulations apply in each case.
- Tables should not be used as a support for the upper body if there is a risk for shoulder dislocation.
